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
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Introduction





Simple and clear conversations provide communicational expressions, using the grammar learned from Grammar Point.




Grammar Practice

Various exercises help students expand the usage of grammar in the completion of dialogs or sentences to build students' grammar skills and confidence in English.




Grammar in Passage





Regular plural nouns

We can count nouns with numbers. One is singular and two or more is plural.

Most nouns add -s, or -es to make the plural forms.

	Singular → Plural
-s	book → books tree → trees
-es	bus → buses dish → dishes watch → watches box → boxes
-ies	baby → babies fly → flies
-ves	leaf → leaves knife → knives
