






The Eiffel Tower and the Statue of Liberty

The Eiffel **Tower** is a symbol of Paris, France. People call it the "Iron Lady." It **was built** for the 1889 World's Fair in Paris. It's 320 meters tall. There are 1,665 **steps** to the top. You can walk or take elevators to the top.




The **Statue** of Liberty is a symbol of **freedom**. It's also called "Lady Liberty." It's in New York City, USA. The statue **was finished** in 1886. It was a gift from France. It's 93 meters tall to the **torch**. There are 377 steps to the **crown**. You can walk up inside to the crown.
