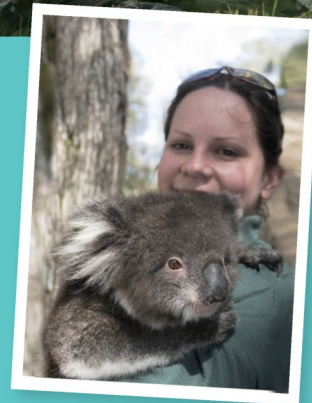

# Animal Keepers

### Who They Are and What They Do

**Animal keepers** work in zoos. They have very **important** jobs! They keep **wild** animals safe, healthy, and happy. They give animals food and water. They **care for** sick animals. They clean the animals' homes.

### Different Kinds of Animal Keepers

There are many kinds of animal keepers. Some animal keepers care for **dangerous** animals, like tigers or alligators. These animals



can hurt animal keepers. Other animal keepers help **different** animals, like koalas, dolphins, or parrots. These animals do not **hurt** animal keepers. Some animal keepers care for baby animals. All animal keepers love and care for animals. Wild animals can be happy, healthy, and safe with animal keepers.
