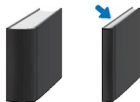

Frogs and toads can look **similar**.
But if you look closer, they are different!

Frogs have a long, **thin** body.
They also have long back legs.
Frogs use their legs for jumping
and swimming.



Frogs have **smooth** and **wet** skin.
They need to keep their skin wet.
So they stay near water.

TOADS?

Toads have a short, fat body.
They have short back legs, too.
So they can't jump high like frogs.
But they can use their legs for **digging**.



EVER WONDER?

Toads dig a hole and sleep inside it during the winter.



Toads have **dry** and **bumpy** skin.
They don't need to stay wet like frogs.
So they can live away from water,
even in the **desert**!
