

HOW DO WE **DEFINE EUROPE?**

The European continent is located in the northern hemisphere. It is the second smallest continent.



Despite Europe's small size, it has the third highest population of all the continents and contains around 50 countries.

> Are you surprised by any of the capital cities on the map?


Look at the map. Can you find ...
