

What can we see at school?




Point. Stick. Color. Say.













Language: What can you see? I can see a (tree). teacher, boy, girl, apple, bee, tree. Ask children to remember the story. Children look at the pictures on the right. Point to each one and ask: Is this from the story? Children circle the pictures that appear in the story (they don't circle the picture of the kite). Point to each picture that appears in the story in turn and ask: What can you see? Children answer: I can see a (tree).




Phonics: bee /b/, sun /s/, tree /t/. Say the letter sounds /b/, /s/, /t/. Children point to the correct letter and repeat the sounds. Repeat with the words and pictures (bee, sun, tree). Next, say the letter sounds for children to point to the correct picture, or say the words and children point to the correct letter. Children trace the lines to match the letters to the pictures, and say the words. Finally, they follow the letters with their finger to help develop pre-writing skills.









Values: Keeping the classroom clean. Look at the scene and ask: What's he / she doing? Is he / she keeping the classroom clean? (Yes / No.) If the answer is No, discuss why not and what they could do better. Finally, children identify and color the children who are keeping the classroom clean.











































Language: Is it a (book)? Yes, it is. No, it isn't. What is it? It's a (crayon). Point to each picture and ask: What is it? Is it a (book)? Children guess what it might be. Then, they color every section with a dot in it to reveal each picture. As they do so, ask again: What is it? When children reveal each picture, they point and say: It's a (crayon)!
