

GET IT RIGHT!



Like + -ing

: We use like + the -ing form of the verb. If the verb ends in consonant + -e, we drop the final e.

X live - liveing ✓ live – living

If a short verb ends in consonant + vowel + consonant, we double the final consonant before adding the -ing.

√ swim – swimming X swim – swiming

With verbs with two or more syllables, we do not usually double the final consonant.


