A listener can disagree or answer differently than expected. In this case, there is often some explanation.



Why We Love Personality Tests

You like those personality quizzes online, don't you? Everyone does! But why do we like them? What are the benefits? Do they have any negative effects?

There are many different types of personality tests online. Some are more serious. For example, they show whether you mainly use your thoughts or feelings to make decisions. Some are fun and amusing. For example, they tell you what animal 'personality' you have. Are you confident like a bear? Or are you easygoing like a dog? Maybe you're social like a dolphin!

We like personality tests because they help answer the question, 'Who am I?' Everyone loves learning more about themselves. It can influence how they see themselves and help shape their identity. We also enjoy these tests because they tell us what group we're in. This makes us happy because we know there are people similar to us.



There are many benefits to personality tests. They can help you understand your beliefs, feelings or behaviour. You can use this to make positive changes. For example, you might discover you learn best by studying alone. This can help you improve your grades. Personality tests can also help with our relationships. Understanding other people's personalities can help us communicate better and make the relationship stronger. These tests can also influence your identity in a positive way. Maybe you thought you were selfish but a test says you're generous.

These tests can also have negative effects. One problem is that they aren't all reliable. Imagine a test tells someone that they are jealous. It could actually be that they just know what they want. Or someone is told they are competitive when they might just be determined. These results may influence their identity in a negative way, even though they might not be true. In this way, these tests may be harmful. Another disadvantage is people can waste a lot of time taking these tests, perhaps retaking them until they get the results they want.

Personality tests are fun and are sometimes helpful but it's important to be careful with them.


We use *it* to talk about the weather and to express time, dates and distance. *It* does not refer to any specific person, thing or place. *It* is the subject of the sentence.


