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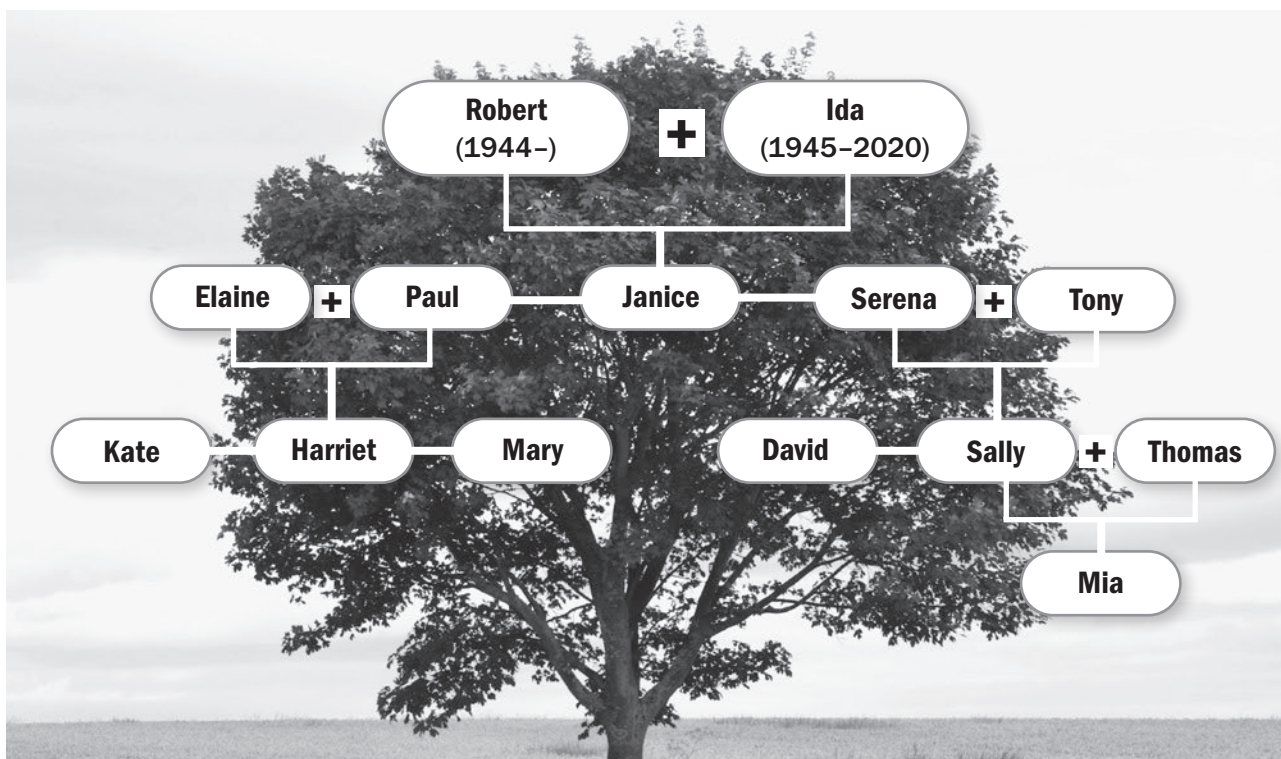

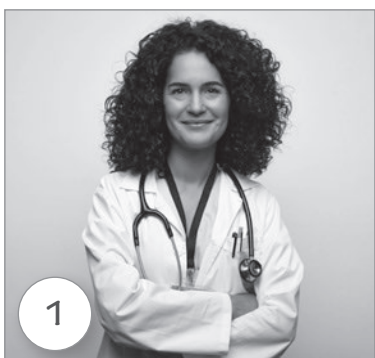

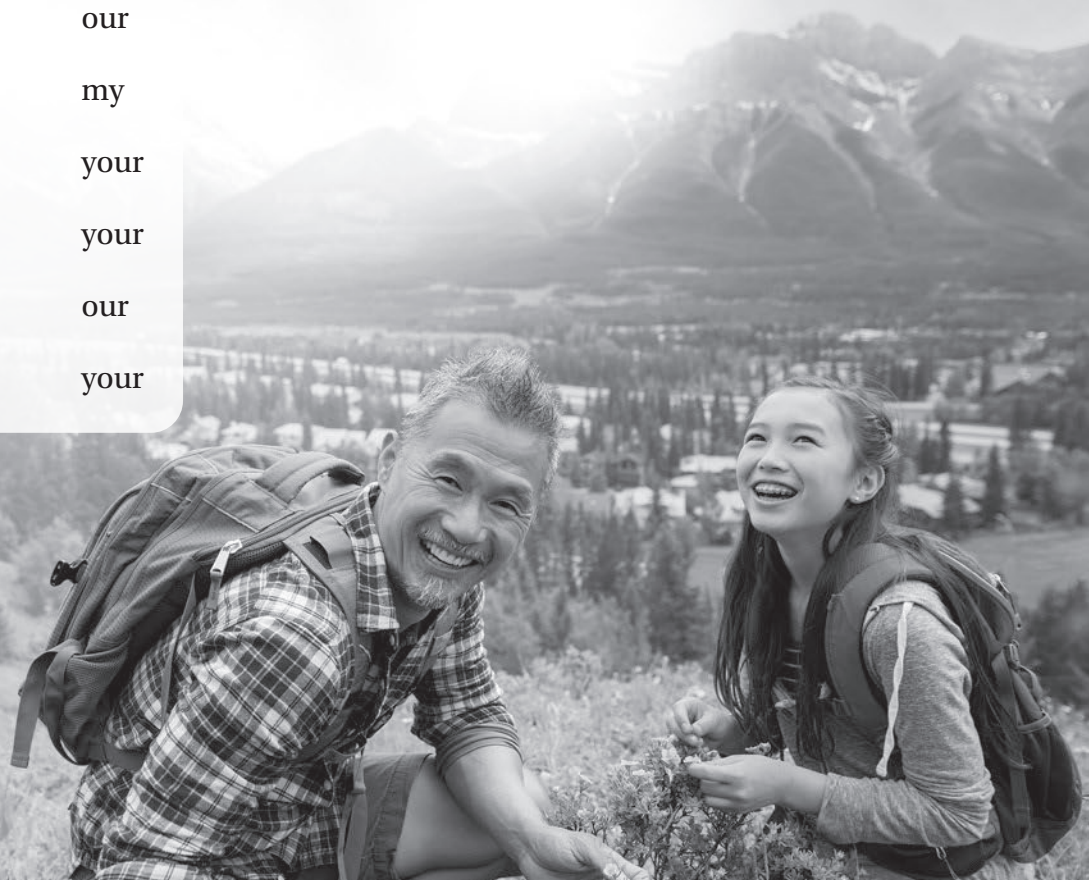

A Family of Science

Think about the people in your family. Are you similar? Do you enjoy the same things? Are you good at the same things? Most families are similar in some ways and different in others. But one famous family has something very important in common: science.

Imagine that it is 26th July, 1895. Marie Skłodowska is 27 years old. Today she gets married to Pierre Curie. Do you know that name? If you like science, you might! Marie Skłodowska gets married and becomes Marie Curie, the famous scientist.

Marie wins the Nobel Prize in 1903 for physics. Who wins with her? Her husband, Pierre, who works with her! That's two Nobel Prizes – one for the wife and one for the husband. Marie wins the Nobel Prize again in 1911, this time for chemistry.

Marie and Pierre have got two daughters, Irène and Ève. The women become famous like their parents. Irène and her husband Frédéric Joliot-Curie win the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 1935.

What about Ève? Is she a famous scientist too? No, but she is a famous writer. She writes a book about her mother, called *Madame Curie*, in 1937. What an amazing family!

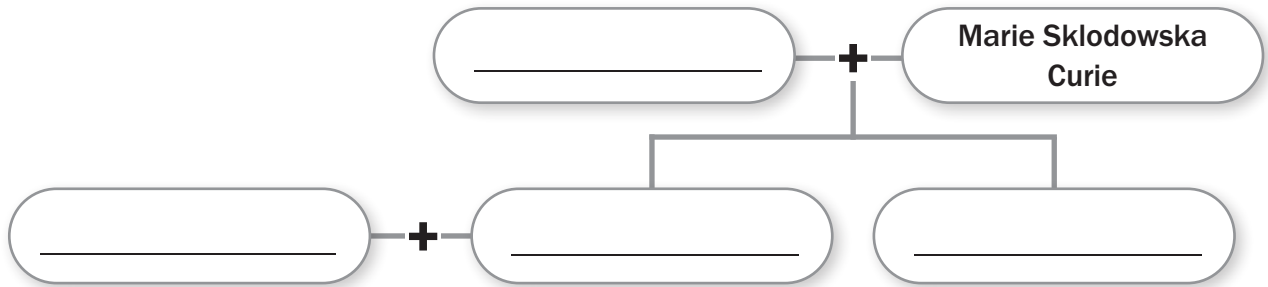
