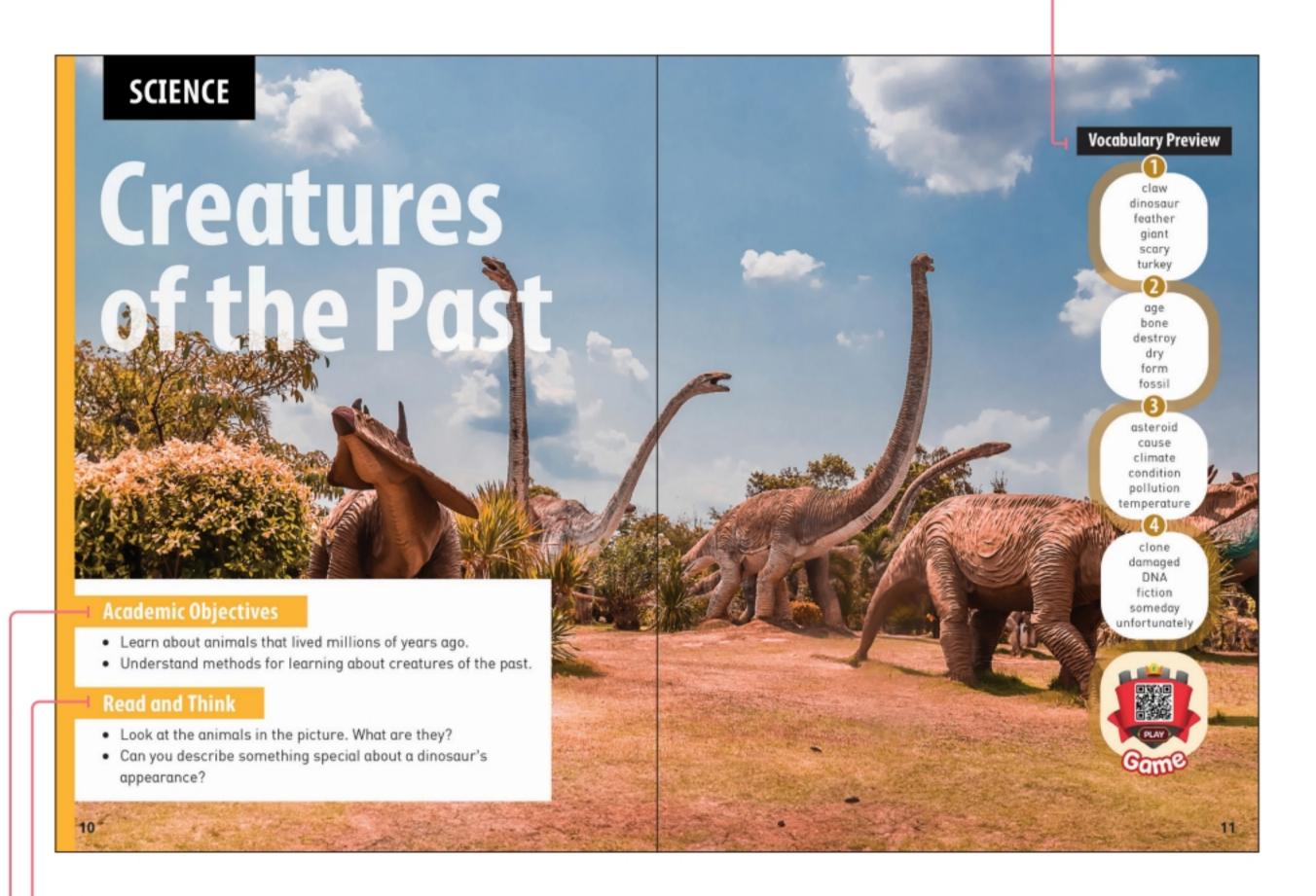

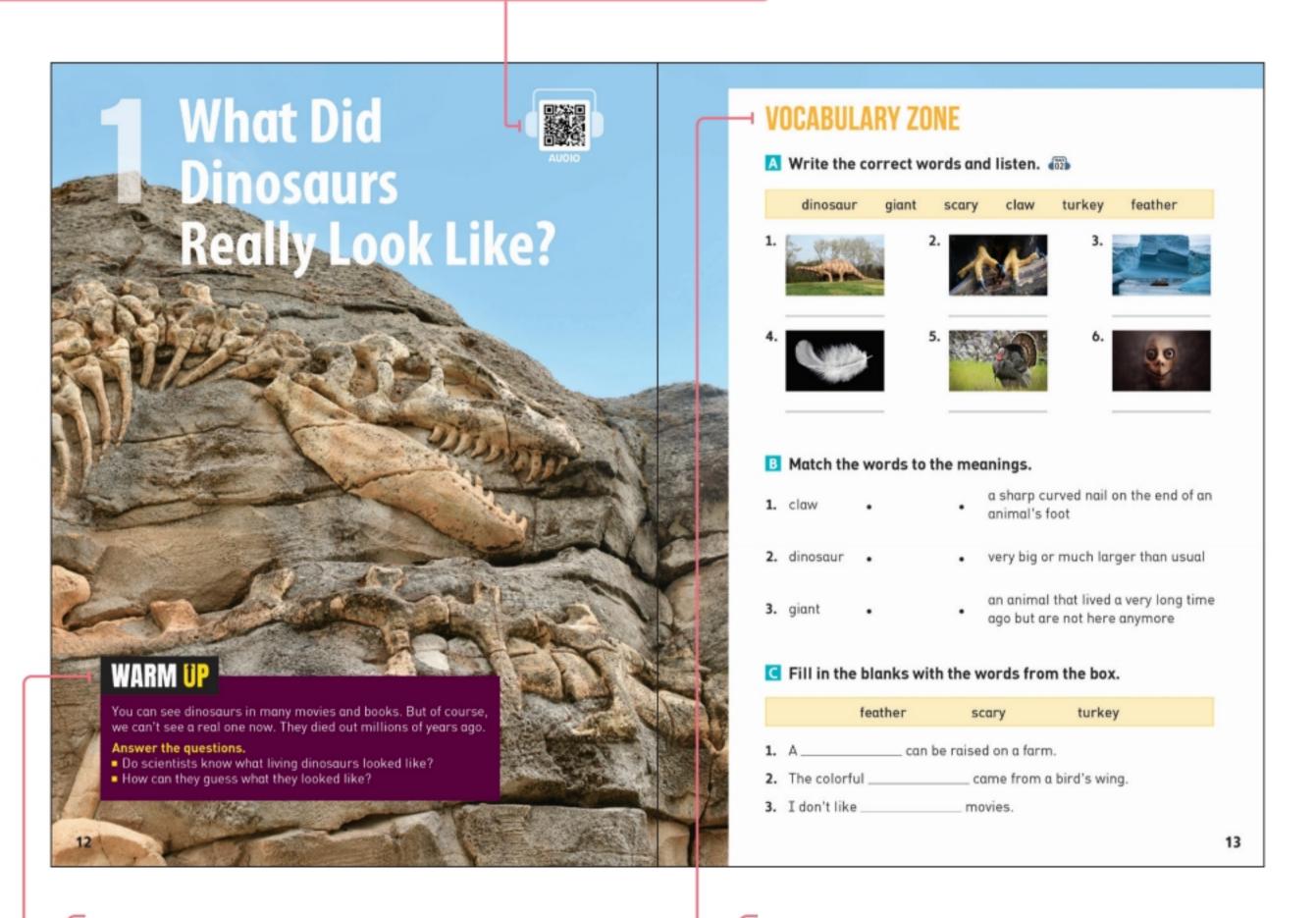

VOCABULARY ZONE

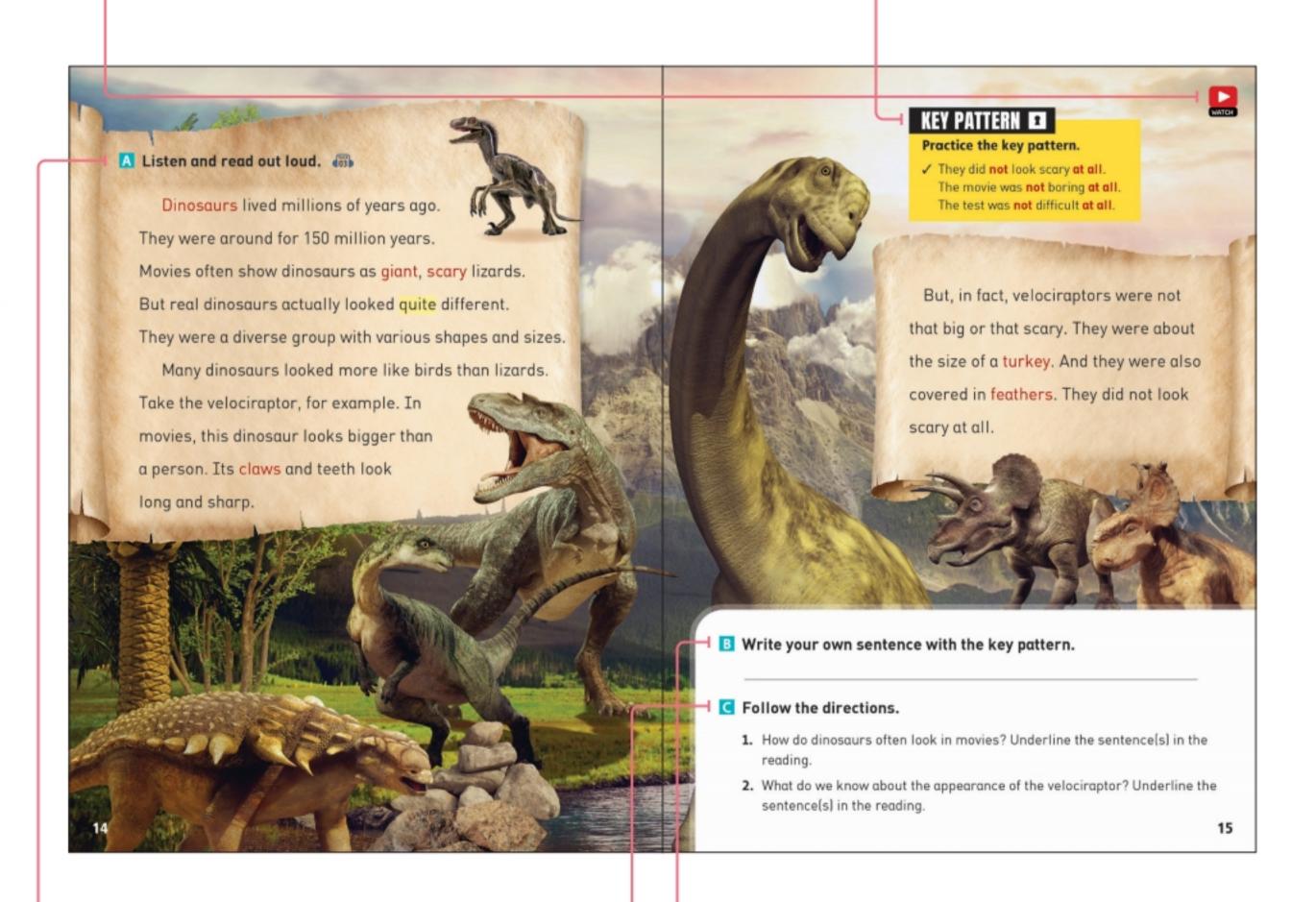

READING A

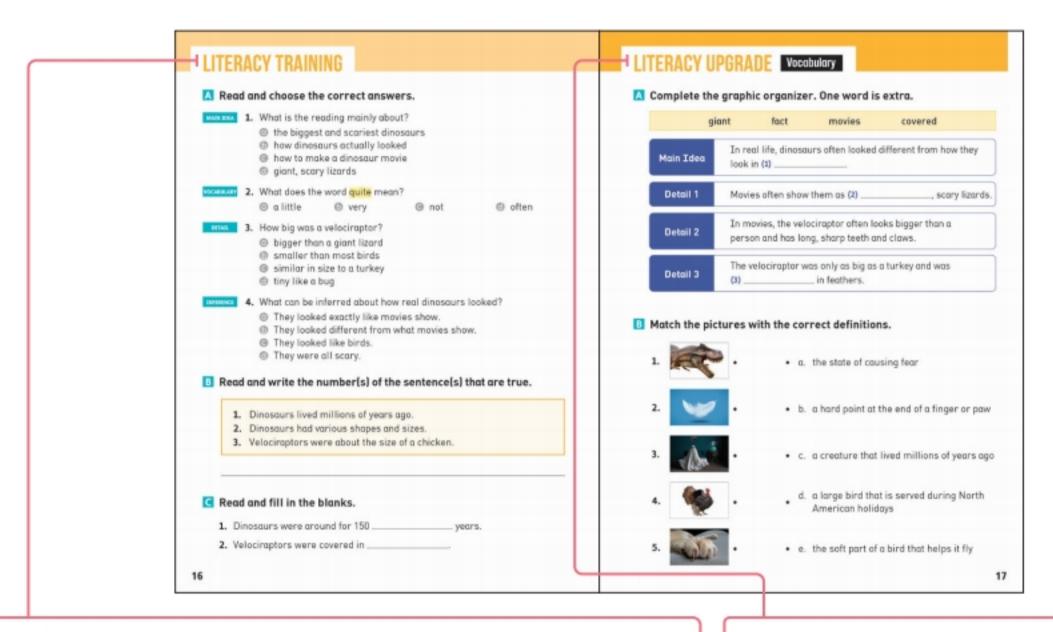
