### **VOCABULARY ZONE**


Students learn the unit key words and then perform matching and sentence completion activities to help strengthen memory retention and ensure they understand not only the words' meanings but also their usage in context.

### **READING A**


Students read a level-appropriate passage about a familiar and interesting topic using the key words.


### **LITERACY UPGRADE**


