How to Use This Book

Each unit in *Vivid Reading with Fiction & Nonfiction Master* includes eight parts plus additional review and consolidation activities in the workbook. These parts work together to lead students from visualizing the meaning of target vocabulary and thinking about the unit's topic to reading the passage and checking comprehension. In the follow-up activities to the comprehension check, students practice basic grammar points related to the passages, learn the meaning of a highlighted expression, and review target vocabulary. A summary of each section is presented here.

New Words

Readings

Ranges from original stories to informative passages presented with either full-color illustrations or photographs. An audio recording of each passage is provided online by a QR code.





Look and Think


Includes a short explanation of the unit along with a key question to stimulate students' interest in the passage


