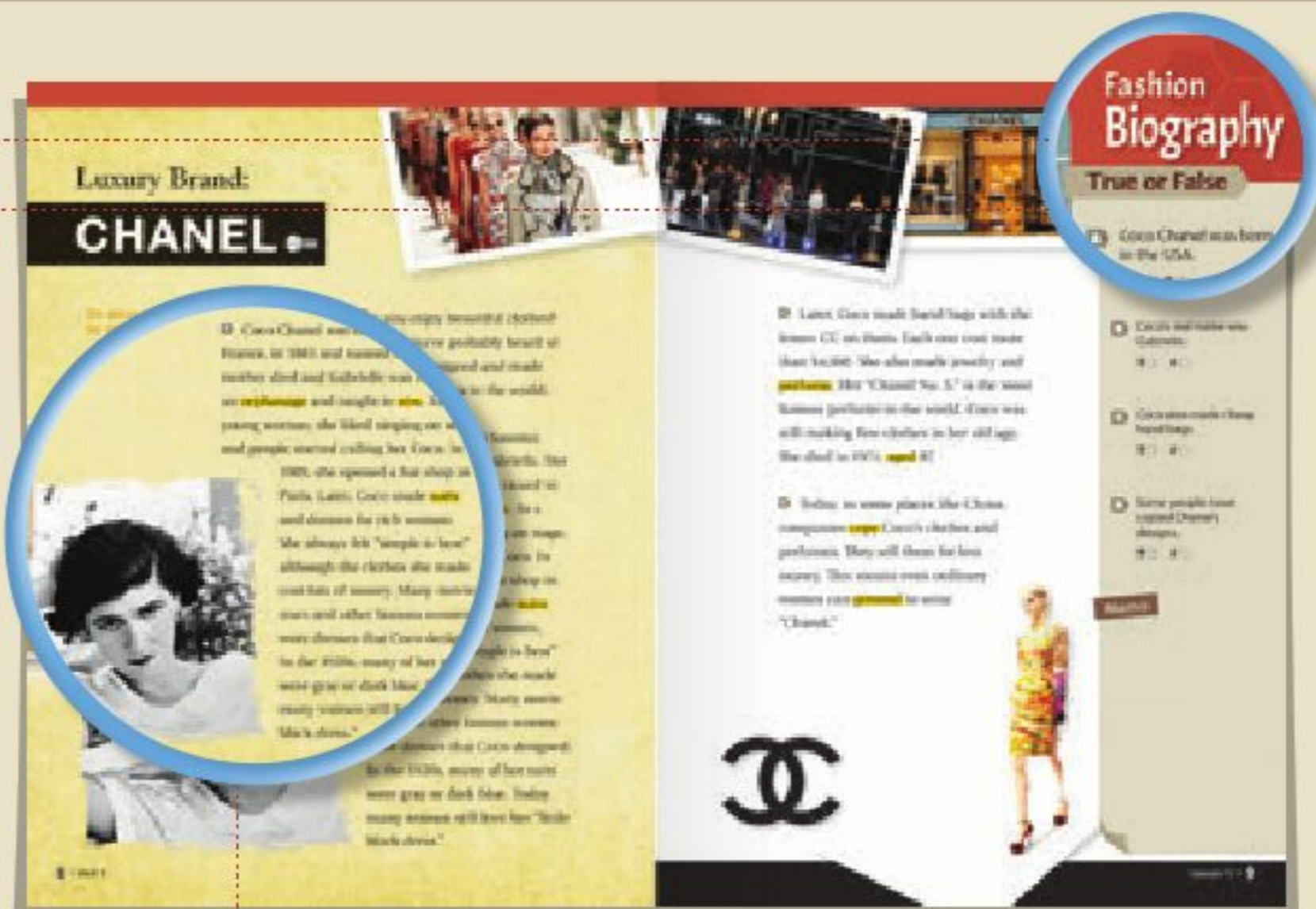

A **D**o you enjoy beautiful clothes? If so, you’ve probably heard of Coco Chanel who designed and made some of the **finest** clothes in the world.

B Coco Chanel was born in Saumur, France, in 1883 and named Gabrielle. Her mother died and Gabrielle was raised in an **orphanage** and taught to **sew**. As a young woman, she liked singing on stage, and people started calling her Coco. In

1909, she opened a hat shop in Paris. Later, Coco made **suits** and dresses for rich women. She always felt “simple is best” although the clothes she made cost lots of money. Many movie stars and other famous women wore dresses that Coco designed. In the 1920s, many of her suits were gray or dark blue. Today many women still love her “little black dress.”

C Later, Coco made hand bags with the letters CC on them. Each one cost more than \$4,000. She also made jewelry and **perfume**. Her "Chanel No. 5," is the most famous perfume in the world. Coco was still making fine clothes in her old age. She died in 1971, **aged** 87.

D Today, in some places like China, companies **copy** Coco's clothes and perfumes. They sell them for less money. This means even ordinary women can **pretend** to wear "Chanel."
