Do you ever think about making changes to your living room or your bedroom? (1) ______ Denmark, Sweden and Norway are all in the top seven happiest countries in the world, according to the World Happiness Report in 2024. So, how do people in these countries create a cosy home and a happy life?

The Danish word 'hygge' describes the idea of happiness you can get from simple things. Many Danish people make sure they have a space in their home where they feel warm and comfortable, often with candles to add to the atmosphere. Research shows that looking at the flame of a candle makes you calmer. (2) ______ That can be especially important when it's dark and cold outside.

The Swedish idea of 'lagom' can also help us think about how our environment has an impact on our mood. 'Lagom' translates as 'not too much and not

too little'. (3) _____ Research shows that if we focus on fewer things and a balanced lifestyle, we can relax and enjoy time with people more.

Lastly, let's move away from the home and look at the Norwegian idea of 'friluftsliv', meaning 'open-air living'. (4) ______ In Norway, it often means hiking in the mountains, but it can also mean going for a quick walk around your neighbourhood. Scientific research proves that getting natural sunlight every day makes us feel better. (5) ______ For example, they improve air quality and can reduce tiredness.
