Life on the road

It's the year 2000.

This is Herman and Candelaria
Zapp. Herman is 31, and Candelaria is 29.

They are from Argentina. Their dream is to travel around the world ... in a car ... in a VERY old car! Its name is Macondo Cambalache, but sometimes they call it "Grandpa"! For Candelaria, and her husband, this is the start of a new life – on the road.

It's now a few years later, and some things are very different. Herman and Candelaria are now parents, with four children. Here they are: dad, mom, three sons, and a daughter. But one thing is the same: Macondo Cambalache, their car, is still with them!

Their children all have different nationalities. Pampa is on the right next to his dad. He's 9 years old. His place of birth is the U.S. His brother, Tehue, is on the left, next to his mom. Tehue is 6 years old, and his place of birth is Argentina. Their sister, Paloma, is next to Tehue. She's 4, and her place of birth is Canada. The other boy is Wallaby. He's 2 and he's from Australia. Is this the end of their trip? No, it isn't – the Zapp family is still on the road! And Macondo Cambalache is not just their car. It's their home, their school, and part of their family!




